EDINBURGH NAPIER UNIVERSITY

Invitation to Participate in Research on Social Enterprises in Scotland

Edinburgh Napier University is pleased to invite you to take part in the research study *Exploring Barriers Faced by Social Enterprises in Scotland*.

What is this research about?

This study examines how social enterprises in Scotland engage with two sets of standards: the People and Planet First verification standards and the Voluntary Code of Practice for Social Enterprises in Scotland. It aims to identify the factors that make it easier or more challenging for social enterprises to meet these standards, why some may find one easier to follow than the other, and the differences in awareness, interpretation, and adoption between the two. Additionally, the research explores the challenges social enterprises face in aligning with aspects of the Voluntary Code, as well as broader barriers to growth and long-term sustainability within the sector. Your input will help shape future support strategies for social enterprises in Scotland.

Who is conducting and funding the research?

This research is partially funded by Social Enterprise Scotland and supported pro bono by Edinburgh Napier University. The research is being conducted by Dr Wendy Wu, Principal Investigator, and Dr Ivana Popovic, Research Assistant, staff members at Edinburgh Napier University.

FREE Nationwide face to face dementia clinic appointments - Dundee

This venture is a partnership between Nationwide and Dementia UK, offering 45-minute appointments with a dementia specialist nurse in their branches. The dementia specialist nurses, called Admiral Nurses, can offer advice to families and carers about:

- worries about memory problems and other possible <u>symptoms of dementia</u>
- how to get a diagnosis
- understanding the diagnosis and how the condition progresses
- practical tips for caring for someone who lives with dementia
- adapting to and coping with changes in behaviour
- financial and legal issues
- transitions in care, including moving into residential care
- emotional support, including anticipatory grief, bereavement and loss

Angus CONECT - The Angus Council Community Benefits Gateway

Angus Council's Community Benefit Gateway - Angus CONECT (Community Outreach for Need, Engagement and Teamwork) - helps council-appointed contractors and suppliers give something back to the community.

How it works:

Community groups submit requests for help. These requests then go on a requests list. Suppliers use the requests list to choose the requests they can help with.

Many groups and organisations in Angus have already benefitted. Maybe yours could too? Requests could be for things like:

- donation of materials: pallets, paint or something else
- volunteers: for things like litter picking, cleaning or driving
- specialist skills or expertise from a tradesperson or trained professional sponsorship
- services: printing, design or help with a website
- upskilling and training courses such as first aid, and mental health first aid
- Something else they're open to ideas!

Who can apply:

You can submit a request if you are an Angus-based community group, organisation, association, social enterprise or charity.

With regards to multiple requests, your group can have up to three requests on the requests list at a time. It's best to submit separate requests if you are looking for more than one type of help, even if it's for the same project. For example, if you are looking for volunteers and materials for an event your group is organising, submit these as two separate requests.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Aldi - Scottish Sport Fund - Dundee & Tayside

The Aldi Scottish Sport fund is a Scotland-wide, community-based sport programme designed to make it easier for kids to take part in sports within their local communities by giving clubs the chance to secure funding.

The Aldi Scottish Sport Fund is open to any sporting organisation in Scotland with registered charity status, from rugby clubs to after school groups and everything in between. Groups can apply for funding for a wide range of purposes, such as new strips, equipment or to subsidise transports costs.

Children in Need Big Sky Grants - Info Sessions

This programme will offer grants of up to £5,000 to support the emotional wellbeing and mental health of children aged 8-13 living in island and remote rural communities.

Grants are for early support to prevent problems developing at a later stage and could be through things like sports groups, art classes, and youth clubs. This is also part of their commitment to funding grassroots organisations who provide vital positive relationships to support children and young people.

Applications will be by invitation only. BBC CiN Scotland are running information sessions and encourage organisations interested in applying (or curious to learn more!) to join them.
