

Core Responsibilities

A sessional youth worker is required to engage with children and young people to provide safe, supportive, and inclusive environments.

Key duties include

- **Planning and running activities:** Organising group sessions, trips, outings, and creative or activity programs to encourage participation and skill development
- **Building relationships:** Establishing trust and positive connections with young people, listening to their concerns, and providing guidance
- **Monitoring and evaluation:** Recording attendance, tracking progress, and assessing the effectiveness of the FNP to meet the needs of participants
- **Safeguarding and wellbeing:** Ensuring the safety of all participants, maintaining confidentiality, and adhering to safeguarding policies and equality legislation
- **Team collaboration:** Working alongside other youth workers, volunteers, and management to plan and deliver sessions effectively
- **Professional development:** Participating in training and supervision to maintain and improve youth work skills

Working Conditions

- **Part time / 3 hours a week:** Sessional youth worker will be required to work every Friday during the Angus school term time with occasional additional hours for holiday activities
- **Travel requirements:** Sessional Youth worker will be based at Websters Sports Centre. Any additional travel requirements will be discussed on an individual basis
- **Qualifications and experience:** Prior experience of working with young people is required, professional youth work qualifications preferred.

Purpose of the Role

The overarching goal of a sessional youth worker is to support young people's development, provide positive role models, and create opportunities for social, emotional, and personal growth. They help young people build confidence, resilience, and life skills while ensuring a safe and inclusive environment for participation.

By combining structured activities, mentoring, and guidance, sessional youth workers play a vital role in fostering the wellbeing and potential of young people in their communities.
